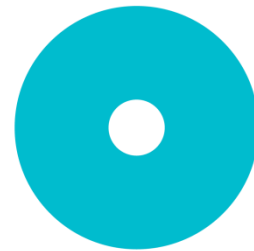

**California Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Coalitions Join National Movement to say NO MORE to Violence**

Sacramento, March 13, 2013 —Today The California Partnership to End Domestic Violence (The Partnership) and the California Coalition Against Sexual Assault (CALCASA) are joining a nationwide effort to launch the country's first unifying symbol to end domestic violence and sexual assault. NO MORE is a groundbreaking symbol designed to encourage change and radically increase the awareness of these kinds of violence in our communities. In the same manner that the pink ribbon signifies breast cancer awareness and the red ribbon signifies AIDS awareness, the turquoise NO MORE symbol signifies domestic violence and sexual assault awareness, and the need to take individual action to end violence.

Partnership Executive Director Tara Shabazz believes that this symbol will unify the anti-violence movement and bring much needed public awareness to the issue.

“NO MORE is the first symbol that addresses the need to end both domestic violence and sexual assault,” she said. “The goal is for this symbol to become just

as recognizable as the pink breast cancer ribbon, because violence is a very real and very common threat in our homes and communities.”

Sandra Henriquez, Executive Director of CALCASA, said that NO MORE Day represents a time for domestic violence and sexual assault advocates, who often work together behind the scenes, to take a public stand together.

"Today on NO MORE Day, the domestic and sexual assault movements stand together to unify our efforts. NO MORE recognizes our respective efforts in the past 40 years and symbolizes our intent to work together to eliminate sexual and domestic violence."

The California Partnership to End Domestic Violence (the Partnership) is California's statewide domestic violence coalition, with organizational and individual members across the state.
